THE LIFE AND TIMES OF DUKE THE ZEBRA

We brought 2022 a close by mounting our annual **Giant Puppet Show** in December on the Day of Reconciliation in the amphitheatre at our local primary school. Titled **The Life and Times of Duke the**

Zebra, the show was watched by a huge crowd drawn from both parts of our divided village, with 130 youngsters taking part. The central character was a young, zebra, torn from his parents and siblings and thrust into the **Barrydale Zoo** where he is tormented by a nasty **Ostrich** who wants to know whether he's white or black. The show attempted to raise awareness that we share this beautiful and fragile planet with other sentient creatures who also have hopes and fears and whose lives are obstructed in

countless ways by thoughtless humans. We also found the opportunity to ask questions about imposed identity in a society like ours where, every time we fill in a form, we are still

required to select our "racial" category.



Centre for Humanities Research at **UWC** and the **Ukwanda Puppetry Collective**, our staff, Interns and several youngsters have over the years achieved a high degree of competence in theatre skills – directing, story-telling, scripting, acting, puppet manipulation, riel dance, composition of lyrics and

Under the guidance of the Handspring Puppet Company, the

musical accompaniment, creation of digital sound effects, photography, filming, set, mask and puppet design and construction. The 2022 Show was created and produced entirely by our own team.

Sudonia Kouter was appointed Director. She was assisted by **Gabriel Buis**, a Net vir Pret youngster recently returned from a two-year acting course with the **Magnet Theatre** in Cape Town.

Herman Witbooi was tasked with the design and construction of the new Zebra



puppet. In this he was kindly assisted by **Vivienne Eich** who has built puppets for major film sets. The
outcome was a beautiful young Zebra puppet
manipulated by 13-year old **Jackwin du Toit** pictured right.

Additional puppet characters included an Ostrich, a Baby Elephant and a Baby Rhino (kindly on loan from Handspring), several Tortoises and Dassies,

an Eland, a Dog, a Baboon a Peacock and a Flying Owl. Our young Musicians

provided both background music and specially composed lyrics to mark the high points in the show and our **Riel Dancers** contributed their understanding of the special relationship the ancient **San** people had with their fellow creatures. The performance was attended by a huge crowd from both sides of our village as well as many others from far and wide who had travelled in for the much-anticipated event.



CHRISTMAS HAMPERS

For the third year running we delivered generous Food Hampers to needy families in Barrydale and on the farms in the days running up to Christmas. The driving force behind this endeavour is Barrydale volunteer Sally Haines who enlisted the help of her Dutch friend Magriet van Straaten. Magriet turned to her friends and neighbours for support and their response has been overwhelming, resulting in 50 families of 6 being fed in 2020, 80 in 2021 and 126 in 2022.

Magriet is on a visit to Barrydale at the time of writing and she is helping Herman organise supply-chain work stations in his Carpentry Studio.



GIRLS ONLY WORKSHOP

Early in 2023 we collaborated with the local **Clinic** and the **ACVV Social Worker** to address a set of problems of great concern.

- Teenage girls in our community sometimes fall victim to inappropriate sexual relationships with older men;
- There is a high rate of teenage pregnancy;
- Being sexually active from an early age exposes teenage girls to sexually transmitted infections;
- Families in our community are trapped in cycles of poverty because they do not have (or choose not to have) the option to plan when to have children.

Our Senior Youth Worker Sudonia Kouter, Board member Elizabeth Beer, Social Worker Anneline Zilch and Clinic Sister Isabella Oberholzer joined hands to devise a workshop with the following outcomes:

- To develop and strengthen the ability of children and young people to make mindful, informed, healthy and respectful choices regarding relationships and sexuality which links to their emotional and physical health;
- To enable young women to be more in charge of their reproductive decisions;
- To enable young women and children to know the direct line of support they can access whenever they might have the need.

The first workshop was held in February. More are to follow and we are planning a similar venture for our Boys Only Programme. The initiative was kindly funded by the Leggatt Trust (UK).

RESTORATION OF MUNICIPAL PLAYGROUND

It came to our notice that the only playground available to youngsters in our township had fallen into serious disrepair. The area had become overgrown and the swings and Jungle Gym had been vandalised with large parts rusting or missing.



Our team decided to clean up and undertake repair work. Staff members Herman Witbooi and **Daylon Pienaar** led a group of youngsters in this endeavour and the



playground is now functioning again. Many thanks to volunteer **Graham** Abbott who got involved in his usual hands-on way and especially to Midas who donated the paint.







KLEIN KAROO NATIONAL ARTS FESTIVAL



Young artists Benjamin Joubert, Chilton Neethling and Rickwin Damons, all Net vir Pret protégées, were trained by local artist Corina Loe ahead of the ABSA-sponsored week-long Klein Karoo National Arts Festival (KKnK) to create art works using string as the medium.





This newfound skill enabled them to create six works that were showcased at the KKnK Festival over Easter. They are now working on a collection of new works to be on display at the **Barrydale Karoo Art Hotel**.

Rickwin, the youngest of the team, is also developing as an accomplished potter. Here he is managing our stall at the **Karoo Daisy monthly market**.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT



• Chess Tournament

Our Chess Team took part in the Overberg Chess
Tournament in March with 5 of our young players
qualifying to go forward to the Western Cape
Provincial Trials in the Strand next month. They are
Carlton Lombard (under 15), Jywan Karelse (under 17),
Warren Pekeur (under 17), Stanwill Jambo (under 17)
– all of whom were awarded Bronze Medals. The fifth



player is Jaywin du Toit (under 19) who brought home a Gold Medal.

• Easter Holiday School

Our first Holiday School for the year ran in the week before Easter. We focused on sport activities, including traditional games and also chess and yoga. 204 youngsters attended.







We also ran a four-day street soccer tournament, identifying four areas in our village, setting up nets in each area and then inviting teams to register to compete.

The event was so successful that we plan to make it a yearly fixture.

 - course for Macleigh and **B Ed** for Zane, who would be training to qualify as a Maths and Life Sciences teacher. The problem was that they were struggling to meet the down-payment of R5,000 the University required. Marion and Dave and their friends came up with the R10,000 and the two young men were able to register.
